## Pop-Up Safety Town Teaches Kids How to Avoid Common Dangers

The initiative, now part of the U-M Concussion Center, provides critical education on concussion prevention, pedestrian and medication safety and dog bite prevention to communities across the state. The initiative travels the state and provides age-focused injury prevention resources to Michigan's underserved and rural communities, including Hillsdale, Grand Rapids, Flint, Jackson, Ypsilanti, Detroit, Addison, Durand, Whitmore Lake, Hamtramck and some tribal communities.

Pop-up Safety Town will expand to Florida, Georgia and South Carolina within the next year as part of the AAP Community Access to Child Health grant program and AAA funding.
